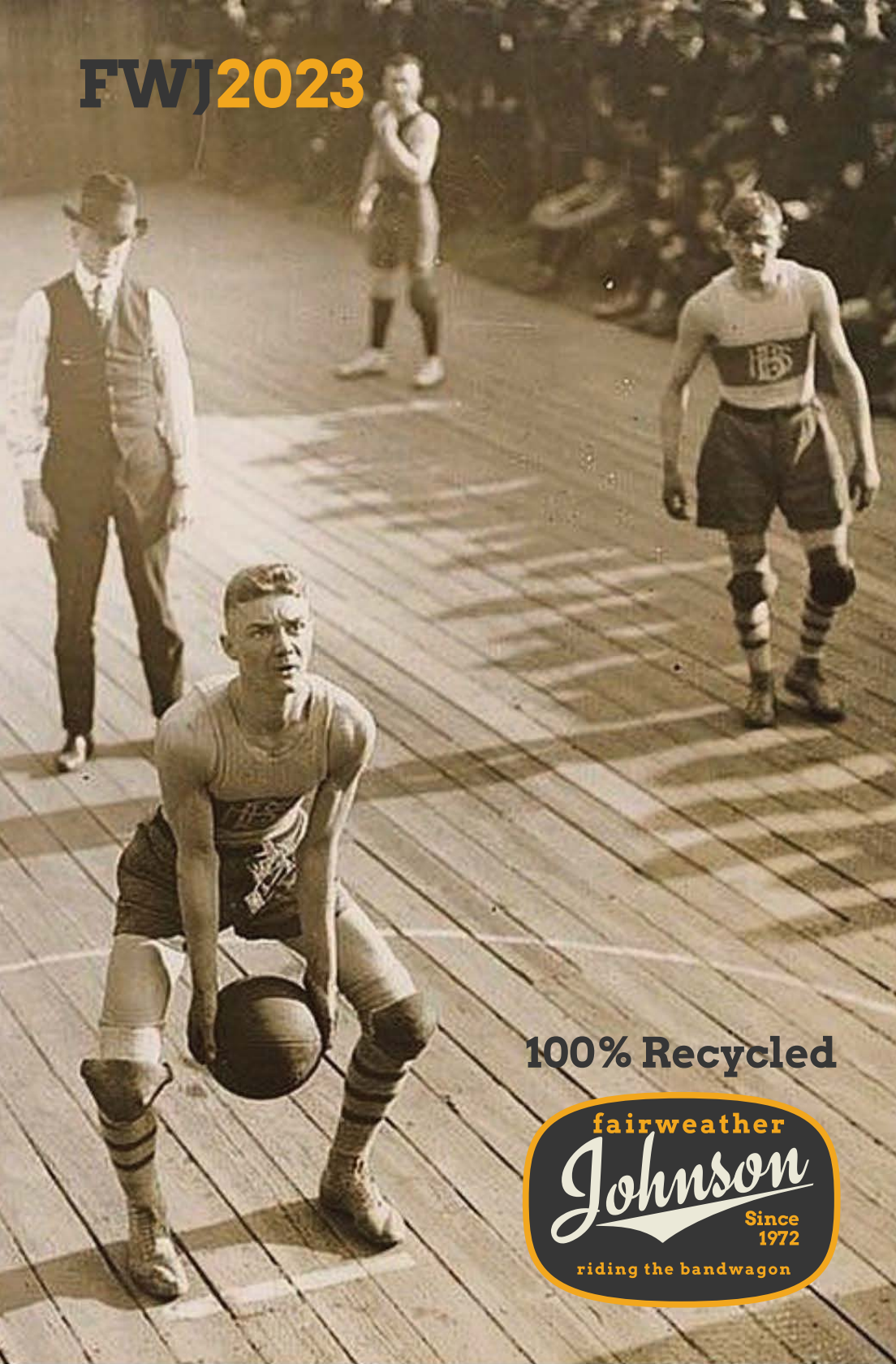

# About Us

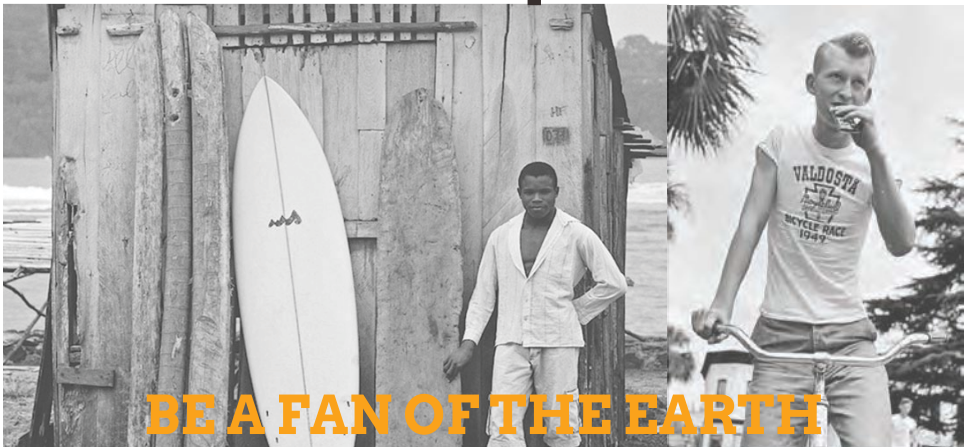

The Fairweather Johnson line is **100% recycled**. Recycled cotton is the transformation of used cotton fabric into fibers that can be remade into products like the ones in this catalog. Reclaimed manufacturing can reduce water consumption by 60 gallons per t-shirt and the carbon footprint impact by 45%.

# Process

Textile waste is the beginning of Fairweather Johnson, *not the end*.

We take the leftover scraps and fabric from production, called post-industrial waste, combining it with post consumer waste, like worn clothing and discarded textile products.



We then separate the waste by color and chop up the material into smaller pieces. This material is blended and processed to achieve the final content and color. Then it is converted to fiber.

This fiber is then spun into our recycled yarn. **There is no dyeing.** All of this is accomplished with no water consumption.

Finally the yarn is knit into the various fabrics and weights offered in our apparel collection

Fairweather Johnson is a sustainable closed-loop production solution.

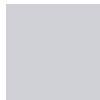

## Unisex S/S Tee

Style FWJ1972, is the beginning of the Fairweather Johnson lore and apparel brand. The **1972** Miami Dolphin's season was the franchise's seventh season and third in the NFL. The team was led by third-year head coach Don Shula. The Dolphins went 14–0 in the regular season and won all three postseason games to finish 17–0, the only undefeated and untied season in NFL history.

## Unisex L/S Tee

The **2003** NCAA Division I-A football season ended in controversy, resulting in a split national championship after both Southern California and LSU claimed the title. This was the first claimed split title since the inception of the BCS, and something the BCS had intended to eliminate. Southern California was voted No. 1 in the AP poll and LSU No. 1 in the Coaches' poll, and ultimately had to share the 2003 college football national championship.

# FWJ1969

## Unisex “Woodstock” Ringer Tee

In the 1960s, the ringer t-shirt became a staple fashion for youth and rock-n-rollers. The decade also saw the emergence of tie-dyeing and screen-printing on the basic T-shirt and the T-shirt also became a medium for wearable art. Psychedelic art poster designer Warren Dayton pioneered the format with several political, protest, and pop-culture art designs printed large and in color on T-shirts. His shirts featured images of Cesar Chavez, political cartoons, and other cultural icons from an article in the Los Angeles Times Magazine in late 1969 (ironically, the clothing company quickly cancelled the experimental line, fearing there would not be a market).

# FWJ1968

## Unisex "Rocker" tee

The rock T-shirt originated in the late 1950 via an Elvis fan club. However, these tees were rarely worn in public and were considered part of a fan club membership pack. Then in 1968 rock concert promoter Bill Graham and his San Francisco-based Winterland Productions decided to use concert tees as a way to help promote local bands like the Grateful Dead and Jefferson Airplane. Graham saw the potential for a "walking billboard" in the tees, and saw to it that they'd have a band image on the front and the band's touring calendar printed on the back.

# FWJ1995

## “Haka” Rugby Shirt

Apartheid was abolished between 1990 and 1991, and the South Africa National Rugby Union Team, commonly known as the Springboks, were readmitted to international rugby in 1992. South Africa hosted the **1995** Rugby World Cup and there was a surge of support among both white and black South Africans who united behind the slogan "one team, one country." Ultimately, South Africa won the 1995 Rugby World Cup Final against New Zealand, and President Nelson Mandela presented the trophy to team captain Francois Pienaar, a white Afrikaner. The gesture was widely seen as a significant symbolic step towards the reconciliation of white and black South Africans. This story became the basis for "Invictus," a 2009 biographical sports film directed by Clint Eastwood and starring Morgan Freeman and Matt Damon.

The original sweatshirt was invented by Benjamin Russell Jr., a football player in **1926**. It began with the new idea for an all-cotton practice football jersey. Tired of itchy wool jerseys, the son of founder Benjamin Russell thought to swap out the chafing uniforms with something cooler and more comfortable.

# FWJ1930

## “Balboa” Hooded Fleece Pullover

The hooded pullover is a utilitarian garment that originated in the 1930s in the US for workers in cold New York warehouses. The earliest clothing style was first produced by Champion in the 1930s in Rochester and marketed to laborers working in freezing temperatures in upstate New York. The term hoodie entered popular usage in the 1990s. Most critical to the hoodie's popularity during this time was its iconic appearance in the blockbuster Rocky film. (*Rocky Balboa*) The rise of hoodies with university logos began around this time..

## “Cool running” sweater

Jamaica competed in the Winter Olympic Games for the first time at the **1988** Winter Olympics in Calgary, Canada. They competed in one sport, Bobsledding, and finished outside the podium. George B. Fitch had suggested that Jamaica begin competing in the Winter Olympics saying, "You got great athletes, and a great athlete should be able to do any sport." Bobsledding was proposed because it played well to the strengths of Jamaicans sprinters. In 1993, Disney released Cool Runnings starring John Candy, which was loosely based on and inspired by the team's experience.

# FWJ1980

## Custom Jacquard Sweater

The "Miracle on Ice" was an ice hockey game during the **1980** Winter Olympics in Lake Placid, New York. It was played between the hosting United States, and their rivals the Soviet Union on February 22, 1980. Though the Soviet Union was a four-time defending gold medalist and heavily favored, the United States pulled off a stunning upset and won 4-3. The victory became one of the all time most iconic moments in U.S. sports. Equally classic was Al Michaels announcing for ABC during the final seconds of the game, when he exclaimed: "Do you believe in miracles? YES!". In 1999, Sports Illustrated named the "Miracle on Ice" the top sports moment of the 20th century.

## “Ice Bowl” Beanie

The **1967** NFL Championship Game was the 35th NFL championship, played on December 31 at Lambeau Field in Green Bay, Wisconsin. Because of the adverse conditions in which the game was played, the rivalry between the two teams, and the game's dramatic climax, it has been immortalized as the **Ice Bowl** and is ranked as the 3rd greatest game of all time. *It is still the coldest game ever played in NFL history.*

# FWJ Sustainable Production

We are the factory. TCRmg - International Trading Company.  
Our factory buildings are designed to reduce long term carbon emission keeping in mind energy efficiency with lean production management systems & automation in all areas of production and inventory management.

## Infrastructure Sustainability

### Sustainable Building Structures:

- Factory built with sustainable building material with thermal insulation wherever necessary.

### Sustainable Electricals:

- Grid & Bus bar planning to save internal power transmission losses
- Total LED lighting (except in QC areas) combined with planned “day” lighting saving power.

### Sustainable Air Conditioning:

- AC Compressors use electromagnets with a starting load of 2 AMPS and zero use of lubricants.

### Solar Power:

- Our factory is located at Netaji Apparel Park, which by itself produces 3.4 Mega Watts of Green Solar energy making our location a green power zone. In addition, we have roof top solar power production to sustain our indirect power requirements out of green energy.

### Vertical Gardens:

- Installations of vertical gardens acts as an insulation of external wall heating, reducing power consumption on account of cooling.

### Water & Sewage Recycling:

- All wastewater is recycled and reused on the premises to water the vertical garden. The sewage is treated in a common sewage treatment plant using solar power.

## Product Sustainability

### Knitting & Sewing Division:

- Molecular strength enhancements of all knitting & sewing machine parts that encounter friction like needles and cams. This procedure ensures longer usability without replacement.

### Raw Material, Processing:

- We are progressing towards the total use of recycled raw material to manufacture knitwear. The usage of recycled cotton-polyester, acrylic, wool etc. eliminates the dyeing process contributing to the production of the finished merchandise with reduced carbon emissions. The water used in any process during manufacturing is recycled contributing to sustainability.
